The County Executive Committee (SCREC) is a body that includes the PCMs and PCWs,
Certain State elected Representatives and
the State Committeeman and State Committeewoman of the County

COUNTY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

aka Seminole County Republican Executive Committee

- PCMs and PCWs are elected every 4 years by Republican Voters in individual Precincts of Seminole county (if no opposition they are elected by default) Vacancies are filled in accordance with State law and RPOF requirements.
- State Committeeman and State Committeewoman
- At Large Florida Legislators representing districts within Seminole County
- The CEC is made up of individually elected persons that make up the Executive Committee who represent 80 separate precincts in the county, State Committeeman, State Committeewoman, and at large State Legislators.
- This group of people elect a Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer to preform the admin functions as directed by and for the members.



The elected CEC Secretary cannot change the processes and cannot make up his own rules and processes

- Only members can make changes to the Local Constitution and draft bylaws **by a two thirds majority.**
- **There is no provision in any of the State Laws, RPOF Constitution, Rules of Procedures or RPOF County Model Constitution that allow the REC Secretary to determine how he directs candidates, and members on how the mandated cites can be manipulated and changed every other meeting.**
- **Any changes to any RPOF rules, Articles and adoption or amendments to processes must follow the Amendments Article and require two thirds approval for any changes with proper notice.**

Steps to becoming a PCM OR PCW AFTER THE 2020 ELECTION

- Florida State Law dictate the limited requirements to be eligible
 - F.S. 103.091 (5)
 - F.S. 99.091
- RPOF Rules dictate the limited requirements following the State Law to be eligible
 - Rule 5 RPOF Rules of Procedure
 - ARTICLE III RPOF County Model Constitution
- Florida Secretary of Elections Forms and Rules dictate requirements to ensure that the Candidate meets the limited specific requirements
 - DS-DE 305CM (Rev. 05/2021) Rule 1S-2.0001, F.A.C. CANDIDATE OATH
 - REC Chair must submit Names and addresses of those candidates (PCMs, PCWs) voted in by members at a special or regular meeting with a quorum and by a majority of members present at the meeting within 30 days of election
 - Supervisors of Elections collect Candidates Oaths, Names and Addresses of Precinct Committee men and women, maintain number of voters in each precinct in order to determine the number of PCMs and PCWs in each precinct etc.

QUALIFICATIONS (State Law)

State law spells out the specific and only qualifications;
RPOF Rules of Procedure repeats State law and, the
RPOF County Model Constitution follows the state law requirements

- Be a registered voter
- Be a member of the Republican party
- Be a member of the party for 365 days prior to filing
- Live in the precinct you want to run in
- There must be a vacant position in the precinct
- Must fill out, notarize and file a CANDIDATE OATH OF OFFICE Form DS-DE 305CM (rev. 05/2021) and file it with the county Supervisor of Elections Office

Note: There is no requirement that the candidate has to send or file it with a REC secretary

- SCREC must submit to the Supervisor of Elections the names (and Addresses) of members voted in within 30 days after election of PCM/PCWs by the members of the Executive Committee

QUALIFICATIONS continued: In addition to the State Law RPOF has administrative requirements

- RPOF has same requirements that follow specific and limited qualifications that Florida Law dictates (see previous slide)
- Candidate must Sign a RPOF Party Loyalty Oath (RPOF Rule 9; 08_17_2020)
- Candidates are asked to fill out a Seminole County Republican Executive Committee Application (v3.0 4/23/2020) and hand it to SCREC Chairman or designee

Note: This Application is not in the State Law nor is it in the RPOF Rules of Procedure or RPOF Model Constitution nor in any existing Local bylaws.

REQUIRED DUTIES OF CHAIRMAN and/or Designee after receiving Application and RPOF Party Loyalty Oath

- the vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of those present at a regular or special meeting of the County Executive Committee at which due notice of the meeting has been given to all members and at which a quorum is present. *County Model Constitution Article III*
- WARNING - No candidate for a vacancy on the committee who meets the registration and residence requirements and follows the rules of procedure prescribed for filling a vacancy can be rejected for consideration by a membership committee, board, or officer of the County Executive Committee. *County Model Constitution Article III*

REQUIRED DUTIES OF CHAIRMAN and/or the Designee after receiving Application and RPOF Party Loyalty Oath and members vote for the new PCM and PCWs

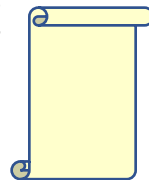
- Within 30 days after the election of the new PCMs and PCWs the Chairman or his or designee will send the names and addresses of the newly elected PCMs, and PCWs to the Supervisor of Elections
- Note: The supervisor of Elections will match the Florida Candidate Oath Form to the names of the new PCMs and PCWs to the list submitted of the newly elected officers.
- In addition, within 30 days after the election of the new PCMs and PCWs the Chairman or his or designee will send the names and addresses and the Original Party Loyalty Oath of the newly elected PCMs, and PCWs to the Republican Party of Florida.

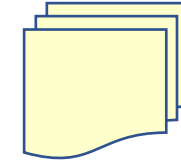

Registration, meets 365 day requirement as a
Republican, Precinct, residence



SOE Voter rolls can be used to check: Number of
Voters in each precinct per 1000 to determine
number of PCMs and PCWs per precinct.
The SOE and SCREC designee can verify within
seconds the number of Active PCMs and PCWs per
precinct and compare to number allowed to get
whether a vacancy or alternate can be elected to a
vacant position.

RPOF Rule 5 and RPOF County Model Constitution Article III Candidate

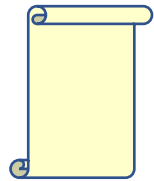
Must meet State requirements and submit this additional document called the **RPOF Party Loyalty Oath** to be a Republican PCM or PCW

State Law and RPOF rules say Candidates CANNOT BE REJECTED IF THEY MEET requirements (There are no additional requirements) to be a Republican PCM or PCW

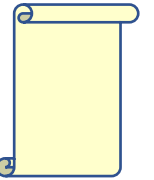
- Registered as a Republican
- 365 days as a Republican
- Reside in the Precinct
- There must be a vacancy in the precinct
- Fill out, sign, notarize and submit CANDIDATE OATH Form DS-DE 305CM to the Supervisor of Elections
- Sign Republican Party Loyalty Oath (pursuant to Rule 9) has been filed with the Chairman of the County Executive Committee

The vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of those present at a regular or special meeting of the County Executive Committee at which due notice of the meeting has been given to all members and at which a quorum is present.

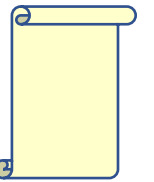

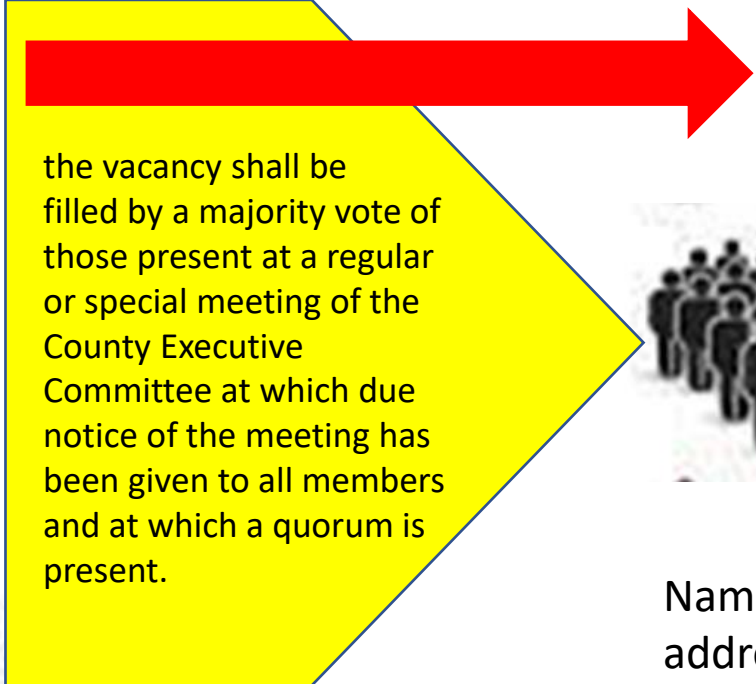
SCREC Chair

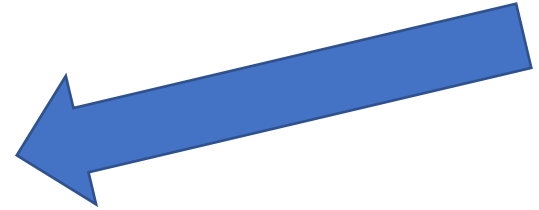


Names and addresses of those voted in must be filed with SOE within 30 days

Names and addresses of those voted in must be filed with RPOF within 30 days

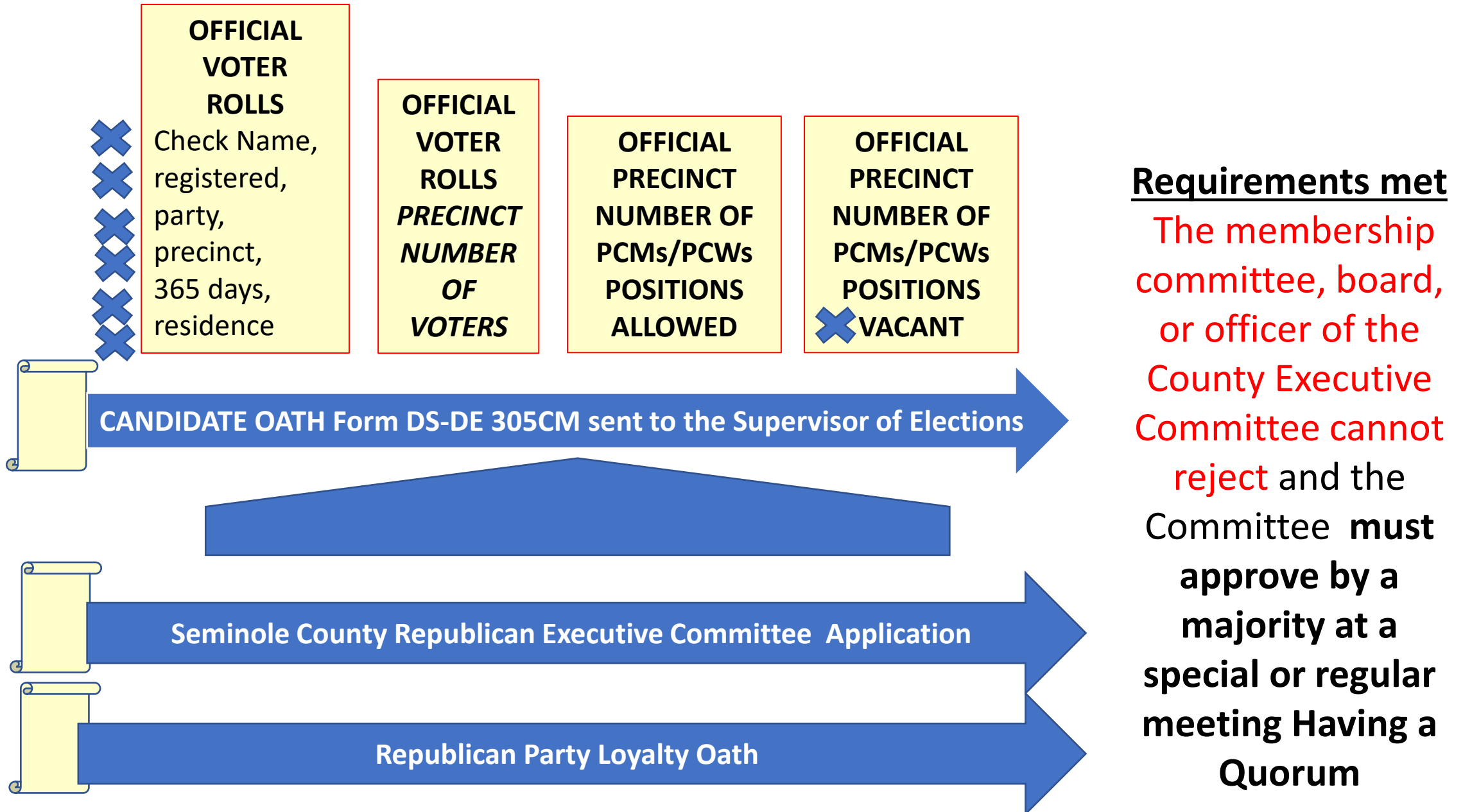


CANDIDATE OATH Form DS-DE 305CM contains inputs that match the Voter Rolls and the SOE has data bases that confirm vacant positions

PRECINCT VACANCY FILL IN A NUT SHELL



Section 3 - VACANCIES - In the event no county committeeman or committeewoman is elected or a vacancy occurs for any other cause in the County Executive Committee, the vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of those present at a regular or special meeting of the County Executive Committee at which due notice of the meeting has been given to all members and at which a quorum is present. Such vacancy shall be filled by a qualified member of the political party residing in the precinct where the vacancy occurred and for the unexpired portion of the term and shall not be deemed a member until the name has been duly recorded with the supervisor of elections by the Chairman of the County Executive Committee or his designee and the candidate oath has been filed as required under Article III Section 5 of this Model Constitution.

No candidate for a vacancy on the committee who meets the registration and residence requirements and follows the rules of procedure prescribed for filling a vacancy can be rejected for consideration by a membership committee, board, or officer of the County Executive Committee. All such candidates must be voted upon by the County Executive Committee. If a county committeeman or committeewoman moves from one precinct or district to another within the same county, and the new precinct or district has a vacancy, then the committeeman or committeewoman may be administratively moved to the new precinct or district without the requirement of an election as set forth above.

Section 4 - In the event of no election of a county committeeman or committeewoman, or where such vacancy is not filled by the County Executive Committee as herein provided, the Chairman of the State Executive Committee of the party may fill such vacancy by appointment, after giving sixty (60) days notice of his intention to do so to the County Chairman by registered mail.

Section 5 – the Chairman of the County Executive Committee, or his or her designee, shall file with the State Executive Committee and the Supervisor of Elections, the names and addresses of its officers and member within thirty (30) days of their election. A County Executive Committee member shall not be deemed a member until the candidate oath (pursuant to F.S. 99.021) has been signed and filed in the office of the Supervisor of Elections and the Republican Party loyalty oath (pursuant to Rule 9) has been filed with the Chairman of the County Executive Committee, who shall cause the original Party loyalty oath to be forwarded to the Republican Party of Florida within thirty (30) days. After the organizational meeting required under Article IV of this Model Constitution, the list maintained by the State Executive Committee, as supplemented monthly, shall constitute the official County Executive Committee membership roster.

Section 6 – Members elected by the County Executive Committee shall file their Party loyalty oath with the Chairman of the County Executive Committee, and the County Chairman, or his or her designee shall forward the original signed oath to the Republican Party of Florida as required under Section 5 above. The oath or affirmation may be witnessed rather than notarized.
